Dear Residents,

Clubhouse Update:


The slow process with the engineering of the new clubhouse has been difficult, we had hoped to accelerate the design, engineering and permit process by doing a lot of preliminary work with our Florida architect who has worked on similar projects with us in the past. This has turned out to be not such a good idea after all. It has cost us a lot of extra time in re-engineering the work for Alabama.

The good news is that the engineering is in its final stages and contractors have received preliminary plans to review and start the bidding process for our review.

We have a strong group of contractors ready to bid and once the bid is awarded we will be ready to move forward with the final engineering and architect prints and submit for the necessary permits to begin construction.

The layout and look is still very close to the posters we original presented, we apologize for the delays but feel the input and reviews were worth it to provide a wonderful new clubhouse.

VOLUNTEER MEETING MINUTES

Grove Volunteer Event Meeting

Minutes for January 2016

The meeting began at 8:45 on 13 Jan 2016. Twenty-five residents were in attendance.

NEW BUSINESS:

A. Volunteer Event Meeting: A brief overview was provided concerning the new open resident meeting format. The emphasis being increased resident input and participation in the planning of Grove holiday or special date activities. To keep on track the meetings will be held monthly and minutes will be published. Resident volunteers supporting this event planning process were introduced:

Tom Tomlinson volunteered to again maintain the clubhouse supplies (paper products, etc.) and is the Point of Contact (POC) for the Grove Cooking Team.

Althia Fox produces the monthly calendar and newsletter

Joanne Smith is continuing as the Grove Treasurer

Karole Moore will coordinate the agenda and produce meeting minutes

Bobbie Traylor was introduced as the Grove's clubhouse and community seasonal decorator. Clubhouse and community decorations are reimbursed by the Grove corporate office (not through our funds). Although Bobbie's decorations are not specific to a holiday, she is the go-to person to find out what holiday or event decorations are on hand.

B. Grove Volunteer Events Book: This book is located in the Clubhouse. The book has individual sign up sheets for future events/holidays. Copies of monthly minutes will be placed in the book.

C. February Calendar (conflicts/additions):

1. Feb 9th BINGO is canceled as the Orange Beach and Gulf Shores Mardi Gras parades fall on that date.

2. Feb 18th (Thursday) at 5:30 pm there will be a Pot Luck Dinner
3. Feb 27th (Saturday) at 7:45 am there will be a Big Breakfast

D. Planned Events and POC Designation:

MARDI GRAS, Monday, Feb 8th. This Grove event will be held on the 8th since the Orange Beach and Gulf Shore Mardi Gras Parades are scheduled for the 9th.

Kathy Olewiler volunteered to head this event. Anyone interested in assisting can check the event book for sign up information.

VALENTINES DAY, Sunday, Feb 14th. Prior to the meeting, The Grove Cooking Team proposed a fish fry. Tom Tomlinson provided background concerning the cost and ethical use of catfish verse swai fish (packaged in Vietnam), or the option of changing the menu to a grilled hamburger/hot dog event. After significant discussion residents voted to keep the event as a fish fry and continue using the less expensive swai fish that the Grove has served in the past. Tom Tomlinson is the POC for this event and anyone interested in assisting can check the event book for sign up information.

ST PATRICK'S DAY. Canceled due to time constraints and lack of volunteers.

EASTER, Sunday, Mar 27th. Linda Lawhorn volunteered to head this event. Anyone interested in assisting can check the event book for sign up information.

e. Donation Basket. Group discussion on the subject of covering costs of food and activities. It was noted through the donation basket the average collection is \$2.00 per person served. Several suggestions were discussed on how to increase the overall donation levels and how to collect the money. It was generally agreed that residents need to be informed that the typical \$1.00 - \$2.00 donation is not covering the actual costs and that the group viewed a \$5.00 donation level is reasonable. Also it was agreed that the donation basket process would continue. In addition to placing this information in the meeting minutes, Althia will address costs and donations in the next Grove Newsletter. It was also noted that in the future if a specific event expected above-average costs, the fliers and announcements for the event will note a "suggested" donation amount or similar wording.

With no other business the meeting was closed. The next Grove Volunteer Event Meeting is planned for Wednesday, February 17th at 8:30 am.

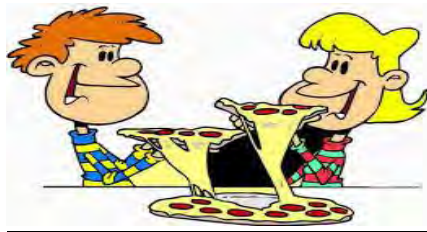


MORNING COFFEE

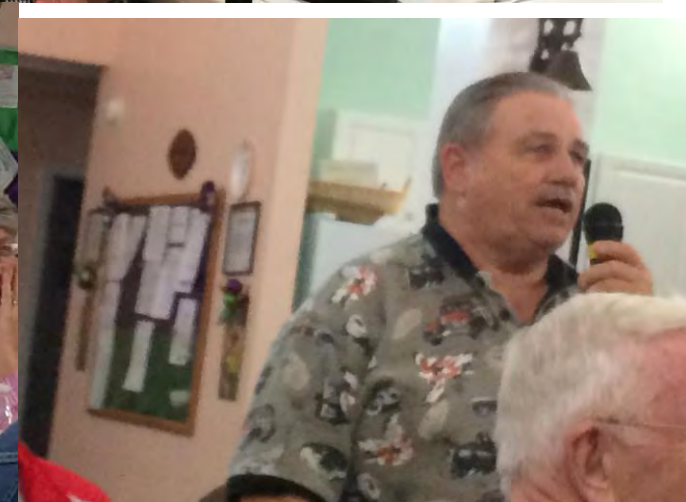


KARAOKE
